One national survey reported that 70% of students thought it was okay to cheat—at least on certain occasions. Another says more than four in ten teens are likely to use artificial intelligence (AI) to do their schoolwork. And a third survey reports that politicians are now thought of as the least trustworthy of all professions.

We have come a long way from the godly qualities portrayed by Abraham Lincoln, the sixteenth president of the United States. One of the reasons everybody liked Abraham Lincoln was because of his honesty. Even before becoming president he was known as "Honest Abe."

According to one story, when Mr. Lincoln was a store clerk, he realized a customer had paid him six cents too much. After work, he walked two miles to give the six cents back to the customer. Another time he had accidentally weighed a customer's tea incorrectly. Mr. Lincoln closed the store and delivered the remaining amount the woman had asked for.


